



“Introducing the New Testament” Study Group

Jesus is the central figure of the New Testament and this study will examine Jesus in three distinct ways: A man like other men, a Jewish rabbi, and the Christ of Christian faith. Then it's on to the cantankerous Paul, the other New Testament authors, and the wild and baffling book called Revelation

The “Introducing the New Testament” study will help the participant better understand this part of the Bible in the context of the world in which it was written. It assumes no prior knowledge of the Bible but can also be a great way for those more experienced to learn and wrestle anew with these texts. All can draw closer to the God who longs for us to live more deeply into the messages conveyed in the Word.

This is the third course in the popular set of Bible studies “Exploring the Bible: The Dickinson Series.” The fall series was an overview of the Bible and the winter series was on the Old Testament, also a six week study each.
