Win Shin Becomes Pastoral Assistant

Winthrop Shin has begun his service as a Pastoral Assistant here at Vincent Church as of September 1. Win has been a member of Vincent Church for several years and has felt a call from God to become a minister. Our church has affirmed that sense of call and he went on to be approved by the Gateway North District Committee on Ministry as a Certified Candidate for ministry. He completed an extensive course last spring called Local Pastor Licensing School and asked if he could begin his service in an expanded and more official role here at Vincent Church. This was approved by the Staff-Parish Relations Committee and the Church Council. Win will serve monthly as a worship assistant and offering children's sermons, preach 3-4 times this year, lead the weekly Reflections Group and a study group unit, assist with the youth program, help us connect with our online worshippers, and offer pastoral care under the supervision of Rev. LeDuc. This will be a volunteer staff position. We appreciate Win's willingness to serve God in this way among us. While Win is taking on this role, we also appreciate his wife Grace and son Daniel and the joy and love they share among us. Let us keep Win in our prayers as he begins this ministry among us that he might learn and grow in his skills and passion for ministry and our church might be blessed by the gifts of God he shares with us.

Comeback Sunday – September 13!

On Sunday, September 13, we will have a "Comeback Sunday" as we regather after a COVID shutdown and after summer! We will share a blessing of the backpacks and devices. Everyone is invited, at church or at home, to "come back" to worship!

Church Office Reopens with Limited Access

The Church Office has reopened as of September 1 with limited access. The church front door will remain locked. Visitors will be asked to ring the doorbell and speak with the Office Administrator by intercom. Items might be dropped off, but to protect the staff, only limited situations will be admitted. Church Office business is highly encouraged to be conducted by phone or email. Vincent Church to Reopen for Worship

Vincent Church will reopen for worship starting on Sunday morning, September 6 at 10:00 a.m. The service will also be broadcast live each week on the Vincent United Methodist Church Facebook page and be available by phone-in. Everyone is asked to enter by the front door, unless needing the elevator using the north parking lot entrance. There will be a health screening for all attendees each week and a needed consent to the church's COVID-19 protocols, which includes wearing a mask and adhering to social distancing. Children will be required to stay with their parents throughout their time in the building. Sunday School and Nursery Care will not begin until later in the Fall. There will be socially distanced seating in the sanctuary and everyone's "regular" seats may not be available. Doors will open at 9:30 to begin screening. Capacity will be limited to 50 people with overflow seating in Philhower Chapel using the Facebook Livestream. Due to the coronavirus, there will be no bulletins, congregational singing, or unison prayers along with other adjustments to the service. Congregants will be dismissed after the service beginning with the back of the church. Rest rooms will be limited to one person at a time. Socializing outside is welcome in a socially distanced manner. Everyone will need to decide for themselves, depending on their risk factors and comfortability, whether they would like to attend in person, watch the service on Facebook from home, or call-in by phone. If you have been exposed or are not feeling well, please stay home, get medical help if needed, and worship remotely. May the Lord guide us as we move into this new style of gathering and worship in this pandemic season.

The role is to arrive at 9:15, setup for entries, take temperatures with a contactless thermometer, confirm screening questions and protocols, and confirm contact information. Holy Communion at Vincent Church

At Vincent Church, we share the Sacrament of the Lord’s Supper on the first Sunday of the month. For those attending worship in the church, please pick up a Pre-filled Communion Set and a napkin in the back of church from the Communion Stewards before the service. If you need a gluten free wafer, you can pick one up there also. Take them to your pew and, at the time of Holy Communion, you will be invited to open the wafer and then the juice and partake. Then please wrap the cup in the napkin and, on leaving the church, you may deposit it in the garbage cans in the back of the church. For those worshipping at home, you may receive the Sacrament of Holy Communion virtually. Our GNJ Bishop John Schol has authorized pastors to offer virtual Holy Communion due to the unprecedented nature of the pandemic, the spiritual sustenance it offers people in connecting with God in Christ, and the understanding that God transcends distance and time. To participate in this way if you choose, you will simply need to have some bread or crackers and a glass of juice or water available at the time for Holy Communion in the service. If you would like to use Pre-filled Communion Sets at home, contact the Church Office to arrange to pick them up. May this continue to be a means of God’s grace to us in this time and of connection and unity in Jesus Christ.

Care Pantry Needs – PLEASE HELP!!

Our Care Pantry provides personal care items for families in need in our area. We are seeing an increase in numbers. We gave out a total of 78 bags this month – about a 50% increase. We are totally out of supplies and really are missing our usual donations. It’s getting harder to purchase items in bulk too. ***We are in need of paper towels, household cleaners, laundry detergent, shampoo, bar soap & deodorant.*** People could purchase the items and leave them in bags in the covered lower vestibule off the north parking lot. Vincent Church is having a study entitled “Invitation to Psalms” based on a book by scholar Michael Jenkins. It is being held via Zoom video on Monday mornings at 9:30 a.m. through October 26. Make a deeper connection to the world of the Psalms so that these well-known scriptures can help you give voice to all aspects of our human experience---joy, faith, uncertainty and sorrow. During two weekly video segments over the ten-week study, experience a varied presentation of individual psalm texts, including dramatic reading, music, dance, and images. Listen to insights into specific psalms presented by one of two biblical scholars through an informal, roundtable conversation format. The study will also assist participants in the practice of prayer and worship and help to connect prayer practice with Scripture. 
