Pick up is "grab and go" by entering the Fellowship Hall doors (masks required), making payment, receiving the meal(s), and off you go! Delivery to seniors is available. So give yourself the night off with a delicious dinner to go...and support the church!

Vincent Church Has Reopened for Worship

Vincent Church has reopened for worship on Sunday mornings at 10:00 a.m. The service is also broadcast live each week on the Vincent United Methodist Church Facebook page and is available by phone-in. Everyone is asked to enter by the front door, unless needing the elevator using the north parking lot entrance. There is a health screening for all attendees each week and a needed consent to the church's COVID-19 protocols, which includes wearing a mask and adhering to social distancing. Children are required to stay with their parents throughout their time in the building. Sunday School and Nursery Care will not begin until after the New Year. There is socially distanced seating in the sanctuary. Capacity is limited to 50 people with overflow seating in Philhower Chapel using the Facebook Livestream. Due to the coronavirus, there are no bulletins, congregational singing, or unison prayers along with other adjustments to the service. Congregants are dismissed after the service beginning with the back of the church. Rest rooms are limited to one person at a time. Socializing outside is welcome in a socially distanced manner. Everyone needs to decide for themselves, depending on their risk factors and comfortability, whether they would like to attend in person, watch the service on Facebook from home, or call-in by phone. If you have been exposed or are not feeling well, please stay home, get medical help if needed, and worship remotely. May the Lord guide us as we move into this new style of gathering and worship in this pandemic season.

Veteran's Day

Veteran's Day is observed on November 11 each year to honor all of those, living and dead, who have served with the US armed forces in times of war and of peace. The holiday was originally called Armistice Day and it commemorated the end of World War I on November 11, 1918. Fighting stopped at 11 a.m., the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month. Vincent Church will honor our veterans with special time of recognition, read the names of those currently on our Military Prayer List, and a prayer at our worship service on November 8. The annual Nutley Veteran's Ceremony will be held on November 11 at the Veteran's Memorial across the street from the church at 11:00. Let us give thanks for our veterans and pray God's blessing and guidance upon them.

Leaf Raking Day at the Cemetery – November 21

The Trustees will be hosting a Church-wide Leaf Raking Day at the Vincent UMC Cemetery at 213 Passaic Avenue in Nutley on Saturday, November 21. The time is from 10:00 to 3:00, though folks can come for whatever part of the day that fits their schedule. (The rain date is Sunday afternoon, November 22 from 1:00-4:00 p.m.) Masks and social distancing will be required. Lunch will be provided at Noon. This is an annual church event with children, scouts, youth, and adults working and playing together. It is a fairly large area with lots of trees and, therefore, lots of leaves. So, bring your rakes and blowers and drop cloths and come join your church friends for a day of fellowship and service.

Nutley Thanksgiving Service – November 22 at 4:30

The Nutley Community Thanksgiving Service will be held on Sunday afternoon, November 22, at 4:30 p.m. in front of Town Hall at 1 Kennedy Drive in Nutley. Gathering around a campfire of hope, there will be a time of remembrance for the struggles of this past year and a time of thanksgiving for God's grace and presence through it all. Rev. Cindy Reynolds of St. Paul's United Church of Christ will give the message, area clergy will participate, there will be the blowing of the shofar, music will be offered and the service will close with candlelighting. Donations will be invited for the COVID relief work of the Nutley Family Service Bureau. The Nutley Clergy Fellowship cordially invites the entire community to attend (using masks and social distancing) or to view the service online at [Vincent UMC Facebook Page](#) or [Grace Church Facebook Page](#).

Thanksgiving Food Drive

Once again we will be having a Thanksgiving Food Drive – but with some COVID revisions! On Thanksgiving Sunday, November 22, members of the congregation are asked to bring to church their bags filled with food for a Thanksgiving dinner and place them in the church front vestibule. For those worshipping from home, they are invited to drop them by the church left front door between 7 a.m. to 1 p.m. from Monday to Friday during the preceding week or drop and go in front of the church from 11-12 on that Sunday. The suggested Food Drive list will be shared in the Voice and emails this year, not on the shopping bags as in the past. We invite you to consider making this a family project with everyone participating. The food donations will go to the NFSB Food Pantry here in Nutley and to CUMAC/ECHO, our United Methodist Food Pantry in Paterson. Please give generously as these and all food pantries are struggling to meet the growing needs of the hungry in our area.

Holy Communion at Vincent Church

At Vincent Church, we share the Sacrament of Holy Communion on the first Sunday of the month. For those attending worship in the church, please pick up a Pre-filled Communion Set and a napkin in the back of church from the Communion Stewards before the service. If you need a gluten free wafer, you can pick one up there also. Take them to your pew and, at the time of Holy Communion, you will be invited to open the wafer and then the juice and partake. Then please wrap the cup in the napkin and, on leaving the church, you may deposit it in the garbage cans in the back of the church. For those worshipping at home, you may receive the Sacrament of Holy Communion virtually. Our GNJ Bishop John Schol has authorized pastors to offer virtual Holy Communion due to the unprecedented nature of the pandemic, the spiritual sustenance it offers people in connecting with God in Christ, and to the understanding that God transcends distance and time. To participate in this way if you choose, you will simply need to have some bread or crackers and a glass of juice or water available at the time for Holy Communion in the service. If you would like to use Pre-filled Communion Sets at home, contact the Church Office to arrange to pick them up. May this continue to be a means of God's grace to us in this time and of connection and unity in Jesus Christ.

Living Nativity Cancelled for 2020

Due to concerns about the coronavirus, the Church Council has decided to cancel the Living Nativity for this year. This is a difficult decision since it has become such a meaningful part of our Christmas celebration. We were concerned not only for the people who would come possibly transmitting the virus, but also for the cast and crew. We even thought of re-imagining how it is presented but had similar concerns. We contacted the animal farm and they were expecting our call and promised to keep us slotted on their calendar for next year! May we remember and even reenact the birth of Jesus in our homes and in our hearts in new and holy ways this year.

Website Note



